

## 6. Melanoma

### MALIGNANT MELANOMA OF SKIN

If the patient presents **with one or more** of the following red flags, then the referral should be triaged as 'High Suspicion of Cancer':

Red flags	YES or NO
Dermoscopy of skin lesion suspicious for melanoma	
Skin lesion <b>and three or more of the following</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A. asymmetry of shape, structure or colour</li> <li>• B. border irregularity</li> <li>• C. colour variation / multiple colours</li> <li>• D. different from other lesions ('ugly duckling')</li> <li>• E. evolving, changing</li> <li>• personal history of melanoma</li> <li>• family history of 2+ first degree relatives &lt;40 yrs diagnosed with melanoma</li> </ul>	

#### IN ADDITION:

**All referrals must** include the following supporting results:

Size of lesion	(space to write size)
Body location	(attachment or description) (space to write location)
Digital macroscopic image of lesion	(attachment)
Dermoscopic image of lesion (if available)	(attachment)
